

LIZA POLITI

Founder & Artistic Director

Liza Politi is a producer, photographer, actor and teacher. As a freelance producer, her documentary and narrative full-length feature films have won a prestigious HUGO award, toured the festival circuits, and have been broadcast nationwide on PBS. Liza has produced "Impact On The Gulf." a multimedia, action- oriented human rights festival that debuted in NYC for the world-renowned Culture Project; and in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, her USO-style Gulf Coast tour, "Broadway on the Bayou" received national attention and was featured on MSNBC. For more than a decade, Liza worked with National Geographic and their legendary photographers, producing expeditions and photography workshops in more than 45 countries around the world.



She founded Statement Arts (2003), a New York City based non-profit that brings arts education and mentoring programs to marginalized urban youth. Designed to help them build the self-confidence and resiliency needed to realize their fullest potential, Statement Arts has received grants from Morgan Stanley, The Disney Corporation, The NY Department of Cultural Affairs, The Manhattan Borough President's Office, The Rudin Foundation and has been featured on MSNBC, ABC News, and Fox 5.

With a strong background in crisis management, Liza spent nine months at Ground Zero as a volunteer rescue and relief worker with the American Red Cross and The Salvation Army. And in 2000, The Screen Actors Guild presented her with the Joseph P. Reilly Award in recognition for her efforts in resolving a national strike. Comfortable on both sides of the camera, she is also an award-winning actor and photographer. Liza graduated from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts, winning the Lee Strasberg Award for acting in her final year. She spent 15 years working as an actress in New York City and was a spokesperson for Sensodyne, Volvo, Gerber's, Olive Garden, and has appeared in Martha Stewart Living, O! The Oprah Magazine, Better Homes & Gardens, and Good Housekeeping.

Andre Catrini is a musical theatre composer/lyricist, musical director and accompanist based out of the Upper West Side of Manhattan. He is a member of the BMI-Lehman Engel Advanced Musical Theatre Workshop, an alumnus of the ASCAP Johnny Mercer Songwriter's Workshop (current ASCAP member) and a graduate of the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati (CCM). Andre is the recipient of the 2014 ASCAP Foundation Cole Porter Award, given "in recognition for his outstanding talent as a musical theatre composer and lyricist," as well as a 2015 New Voices Project Merit Award. His song, "My World," appears on the new album, 16 Stories, featuring the Australian Discovery Orchestra, and is available on Apple Music and Spotify. His musical The Astonishing Times of Timothy Cratchit (book by Allan Knee) had its UK premiere production at the Hope Mill Theatre in Manchester, England in the fall of 2019. Andre is currently developing a musical with actress and activist Alexandra Billings based on her life story, titled S/He & Me. As a photographer, his work can be seen in "Colors of San Miguel" and he was the editor for "Diehards", "King for a Day" and the soon to be released, "2020 Unmasked".For 10 years, he taught photography workshops for National Geographic and their legendary photographers including, Joe McNally, Bob Sacha, Ira Block, VII's agency Ed Kashi and Magnum's David Alan Harvey. Start Young SUMMER MUSIC & THEATER 2023



Week One

Monday 7/11 Learn vocabulary; Projection, Articulation, 4th Wall. Physical Warm up by Ramón & Vocal Warm-up w/ James. Learn "Brand New Day." Learn choreography to Brand New Day. Music Lesson, introduce vocab, etc. Set Artist Expectations to space and to each other. Writing Prompt "What is something that you want to see changed in the world?" Discussion: Ask the students to bring in 4 images that are important to them.

Begin the day with an icebreaker: Human Bingo Board! Physical Warm Up by Ramon & Vocal Warm Up w/ James. Brainstorm ideas for the show and discuss those that are common. Review "Brand New Day." Learn "Magic To Do." Learn choreography for "Magic To Do." Learn "Proud Mary." End in a group circle.

FIELD TRIP TO NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM!

Begin the day with an icebreaker: Human Bingo Board! Physical Warm Up by Ramon & Vocal Warm Up w/ James. Brainstorm ideas for the show and discuss those that are common. Review "Brand New Day." Learn "Magic To Do." Learn choreography for "Magic To Do." Learn "Proud Mary." End in a group circle.

Thursday 7/14

Learn vocabulary: Students will learn Stage Directions vocab. Physical warm-up with Ramon & Vocal Warm Up with James. Solidify the theme of the show through guided discussion and begin to choose association words with the theme. Finish learning "Amor Prohibido." Learn choreography to "Amor Prohibido." Review all music. End in a group circle.



Art for a Conscious World Week Two

Monday 7/18 Silent Scene: Students will create a scene in silence using Gestures, facial expression, and physicality. Learn vocab: Gestures, Facial Expressions, Physicality. Physical/Vocal Warm-ups STUDENT LED. Physical Warm up by. Ramón & Vocal Warm-up w/ James. Review all music. Review all choreography. Soul Train Line. Music notes from morning review. Start to form 1-2 scenes and or interpretive movement w/ words to our show. Divide them into smaller groups to have them create scenes or movement. End in group circle.

4 Line Scene: Create a scene using only 4 lines given to everyone prior to the rehearsal time. Learn vocab: Operative Word- Inflection. Physical Warm up by Ramón. Vocal Warm-up w/ James. Review the whole show. Review all choreography. Music review. End in a group circle.

Tuesday 7/19

Wednesday 7/20 Park Bench: Students objective will be to get someone to leave the park bench w/o touching them. Learn vocab: Tactics and Objectives. Physical/Vocal Warm-ups STUDENT LED. Physical Warm up by Ramón. Vocal Warm-up w/ James. Solidify the scene and block the transitions. End in a group circle.

ABC's Newscast: Students will portray news anchors, weather, sports and only speak, having the first word of each sentence go in the order of the A,B,C's. Physical/Vocal Warm-ups STUDENT LED. Physical Warm up by Ramón & Vocal Warm-up w/ James. Dress Rehearsal (Run 1). Discuss Intentions for Run 2. Dress Rehearsal (Run 2). End in a group circle.



RAMON GUZMAN Acting Teacher (Gr. 7-11)



Ramón is a Brooklyn native who received his BFA in Acting/Musical Theater from Marymount Manhattan College and studied abroad for a summer at The British American Drama Academy. Ramón has been a Theater Educator for 6 years, predominantly in Harlem. Favorite acting credits include 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee (Mitch Mahoney), Oliver! (Fagin), and Little Shop of Horrors (Audrey II). Ramón is also a playwright, receiving awards for his writing at the New York Theater Fest. and a recipient of the Jeremy O. Harris Pet Project Grant.
